Personal, Social, Health Education

Being my best

Understanding the stages of learning and how a Growth Mindset supports us through learning.

Looking after my body – healthy and unhealthy choices. Understand how germs can spread and the importance of handwashing. Healthy routines – the importance of cleaning our teeth, exercise and sleep.

Growing and changing

Identify different stages of growth, identify which parts of our body are private, understanding what privacy means. Inappropriate touch and how that makes someone feel. Safe and unsafe secrets.

Music

Compose and create

Year 1 – The children will rehearse and compose simple four beat rhythms by clapping, chanting and performing on untuned percussion.

Year 2 – The children will learn how timbre and rhythm can be used to represent animals. They will create short pieces, recording these on graphic scores to represent a chosen animal.

Science

Plant Parts

The children will learn about wild and garden plants by exploring the local environment. They identify and describe the basic parts of plants and observe how they change over time.

Animal Parts

The children will learn about animals, including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds, mammals and invertebrates. They identify and describe their common structures, diets, and how animals should be cared for.

Art and Design

Flower Head

The children will learn about the visual elements of flowers, including shape, texture, colour, pattern and form. They also explore various artistic methods, including drawing, printmaking and 3-D forms, using paper and clay.

Design and technology

Beach Hut

The children will learn about making and strengthening structures, including different ways of joining materials.

Mathematics Year 1

Number and Place Value

- Add and subtract one-digit and two-digit numbers to 20
- Solve one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction
- Recognise and know the value of different denominations of coins and notes.
- Solve one-step problems involving multiplication and division, by calculating the answer using concrete objects, pictorial representations and arrays with support.
- Recognise, find and name a half as one of two equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.
- Recognise, find and name a quarter as one of four equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.

Measures

- Tell the time to the hour and half past the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times.
- Measure and begin to record lengths and heights.

Mathematics Year 2

Number and Place Value

- Recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 fluently, and derive and use related facts up to 100
- Add and subtract 2-digit numbers.
- Double and halve 1 and 2-digit numbers and amounts of money.
- Calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division within the multiplication tables and write them using the multiplication (x), division (÷) and equals (=)
- Solve problems involving multiplication and division.
 - Recognise, find, name and write fractions $\frac{1}{3}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{2}{4}$ and $\frac{3}{4}$ of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity.
- Write simple fractions for example, $\frac{1}{2}$ of 6 = 3 and recognise the equivalence of $\frac{2}{4}$ and $\frac{1}{2}$.

Measures

- Tell and write the time to five minutes, including quarter past / to the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times. Compare and sequence intervals of time.

Geometry

- Order and arrange combinations of mathematical objects in patterns and sequences.
- Identify and describe the properties of 2-D shapes, including the number of sides and symmetry in a vertical line.
